5.0 Discussion Items/Presentation Items

5.1 Signal Mode in Metro's Call for Projects

Randy Lamm discussed Metro's interest in obtaining recommendations from area COG's to improve Metro's Call for Projects as it relates to signal synchronization. In the previous Call for Projects Metro's signal synchronization category received 19 projects and recommended 18 with 28% of projects coming from cities and 64% from counties, which is less than previous years. Mr. Lamm stated that the next call for projects will be in 2011 and encouraged inter-jurisdictional projects to apply.

5.2 Non-Proprietary Recycling Methods for Asphalt Pavements

Craig Harrington presented on the Cold In-Place Recycling and Cold Central Plant Recycling methods for asphalt pavements and the benefits associated with these processes. Mr. Harrington stated that these recycling methods can lead to a reduction in cost to cities (30%-50%), the amount of construction time, and the amount of equipment needed to repave streets from traditional paving methods. Mr. Harrington provided numerous examples of recycling projects that have been undertaken in various communities throughout Southern California.
