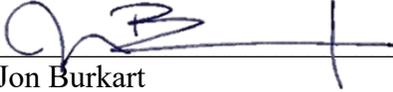

## **BACKGROUND**

In January 2026, LA Metro Board Chair Fernando Dutra formed a new Ad Hoc Board Composition Committee to examine and consider potential changes to the Metro Board structure. The structure of the agency's governing board has remained unchanged since 2003. In 2024, voters in LA County approved Measure G to expand the County's Board of Supervisors – all of whom are Metro Board members – from 5 to 9 Supervisors and institute an elected Chief Executive Officer.

Considering the impending changes to governance in LA County, Chair Dutra created the Ad Hoc Committee to examine Measure G's potential implications to the Metro's governing board. The Committee will review the Board's current composition, solicit stakeholder input, and evaluate potential reforms. The Committee's work will culminate in a report with their recommendations by June 30, 2026.

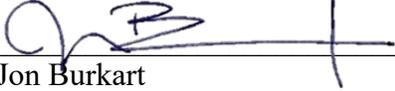

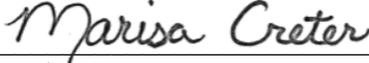

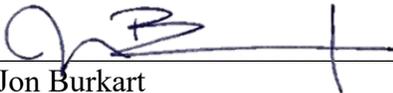
## **BACKGROUND**

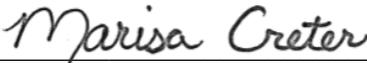
In 2023, the City of Pasadena received \$2 million from the Federal Reconnecting Communities Pilot (RCP) Grant Program to develop a master plan for the northern 710 freeway stub. The RCP program, established by the 2021 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, funds community-centered projects that reconnect communities harmed by legacy infrastructure projects. Pasadena committed \$2 million in local match funds of the \$5 million they received in 2022 upon Caltrans relinquishing property intended for the unfinished 710 Freeway.

Plans for the roughly 50-acre strip of land include reconnecting the local street grid; improving active transportation infrastructure and open space; and supporting a wide range of land use to complement development in Old Pasadena. The “Reconnecting Pasadena” project will culminate with entitlement of the land and identification of pathways for future development. The City selected consultant Perkins Eastman to develop the master plan, which is guided by several key principles that align with the RCP program goals, including:

- **Community Engagement:** gathering input from a wide range of stakeholders
- **Restorative Justice:** listening to life stories and oral histories from those displaced
- **Data Collection:** mapping a full picture of the site and its physical attributes
- **Economic Analysis:** analyzing the current market and future trends for development
- **Resiliency and Sustainability:** exploring greener infrastructure on a large scale
- **Land Use and Place-making:** establishing new neighborhoods and spaces
