## SGVCOG Launches JPA Negotiations for Regional Housing Trust Fund

Since last year, the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) has been working with cities and stakeholders to explore the possibility of forming a San Gabriel Valley Regional Housing Trust Fund. A Regional Housing Trust Fund (RHTF) would create a vehicle for the region to receive and distribute funding to support the planning and construction of affordable housing and homeless housing in the San Gabriel Valley.

At the request of SGVCOG, Senator Susan Rubio introduced SB 751 to allow San Gabriel Valley cities to form a joint powers authority to receive and disperse both public and private funding and financing for the planning and construction of affordable and homeless housing. SB 751 is expected to be approved by Governor Newsom. Once enrolled as law, the RHTF could form as early as January 1, 2020.

SGVCOG launched the joint powers authority (JPA) negotiations with a kick-off meeting on Wednesday, September 25, 2019. The JPA meetings, which provide cities with the opportunity to influence the Trust's authorities, administration, membership, organization, and funding, will continue through December.

Any interested jurisdictions in the San Gabriel Valley can participate in these negotiation meetings. SGVCOG is requesting that each interested jurisdiction designate a delegate and alternate that can consistently participate in the negotiation meetings. # Los Angeles County Approves Allocation of \$6 Million for Cities to Combat Homelessness

On Tuesday, September 10, 2019, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved a motion by Supervisors Kathryn Barger and Hilda Solis to allocate \$6 million to equip cities with tools to implement plans to combat homelessness in their communities.

Using Measure H funds that were directed to councils of governments (COGs), the initiative will enable cities to support activities that align with the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors' Homeless Initiative Action Plan to Prevent and Combat Homelessness.

This motion also provides for a return of \$6 million in tax-generated funds to the cities and directs the Los Angeles County Chief Executive Officer to report back to the Board of Supervisors within 45 days with a framework to provide funding for COGs to distribute to their respective cities.

Funding will be directed at activities that support **two** priority areas:

- 1. To increase the supply of supportive and interim housing for individuals experiencing homelessness; and,
- 2. To enhance the effectiveness of Los Angeles County service systems for those experiencing and/or at-risk of homelessness.

This funding will ensure that cities in Los Angeles County have more flexibility when implementing their homeless plans. It is anticipated that the funding will be divided between the COG based on results from the 2019 Point-in-Time (PIT) Homeless Count. The San Gabriel Valley is expected to receive approximately \$1.5 million out of the \$6 million allocation.









### **626 Golden Streets: Streets and Treats Overview**



After hosting the Mission-to-Mission Golden Streets event earlier in May, ActiveSGV is organizing another open streets event in the San Gabriel Valley in partnership with the SGVCOG and the Cities of El Monte and South El Monte. 626 Golden Streets: Streets and Treats is scheduled to be on Saturday, October 26, 2019 from 9:00am to 4:00pm. This carfree event allows residents to walk, run, bike, and explore San Gabriel Valley across 4.5 miles of open streets in El Monte and South El Monte.




The route will connect ActiveSGV's office at the Jeff Seymour Family Center in El Monte, the annual Dia de los Muertos Festival on Main Street, the Children's Day Parade, and zigzags its way to the South El Monte Civic Center. Three major festival hubs will be placed along the route to provide attendees with places to rest and relax. # SGVCOG Capital Project and Construction Committee Hosts Tour of ACE Projects

In August, the SGVCOG Capital Projects and Construction Committee held a tour of completed and ongoing Alameda Corridor-East (ACE) construction projects in the San Gabriel Valley. The ACE Project is a comprehensive program of constructing grade separations to increase safety, improve air quality, foster economic vitality, and enhance mobility. To date, ACE has completed 14 rail-roadway grade separations. 3 grade separations are under construction with another 2 grade separations and 8 crossing safety projects in their design phases.



Additionally, the committee toured the planned Turnbull Canyon project in the City of Industry and the unincorporated community of Hacienda Heights. This project is expected to begin construction in the next few months. Finally, the committee toured the construction sites of the Durfee Avenue project in City of Pico Rivera and the Fairway Drive and Fullerton Road projects in the City of Industry and the unincorporated community of Rowland Heights.

## SGVCOG Partners with Energy Coalition to Promote SoCalREN Public Agency Program

The SGVCOG Governing Board approved a contract with the Energy Coalition (TEC) to provide funding to the SGVCOG to support regional public agency engagement for the Southern California Regional Energy Network (SoCalREN) on Thursday, September 19, 2019. SGVCOG staff will collaborate with TEC to facilitate engagement of San Gabriel Valley public agencies, including cities, counties, water agencies, school districts, and other special districts, for the SoCalREN Public Agency Program.



This program has led to the implementation of 599 energy and/or water efficiency projects in publicly-owned facilities throughout Southern California since 2013. Currently, the SoCalREN Public Agency Program serves 120 public agencies, including 15 cities located in the San Gabriel Valley.


#### What do you love most about working at SGVCOG?
