# MONTH AT GLANCE

During the month of July, the Neighborhood Coyote Program continued to document reports and share relevant information with residents who reported coyote activity in their neighborhoods.

It is not uncommon for coyotes to be sighted throughout the day as they may be seeking food opportunities or transitioning between different neighboring areas. Coyotes occasionally appear in residential yards. When encountering such a situation and determining that the coyote is passing through without apparent interest, it is advisable to refrain from intervention and stay indoors. However, if a coyote shows attraction to something in your yard, it is crucial to deter it through appropriate hazing methods. Allowing the coyote to linger without discouragement may lead to recurrent sightings. Ensuring your yard does not have any attractants will discourage the coyote from returning to your property.

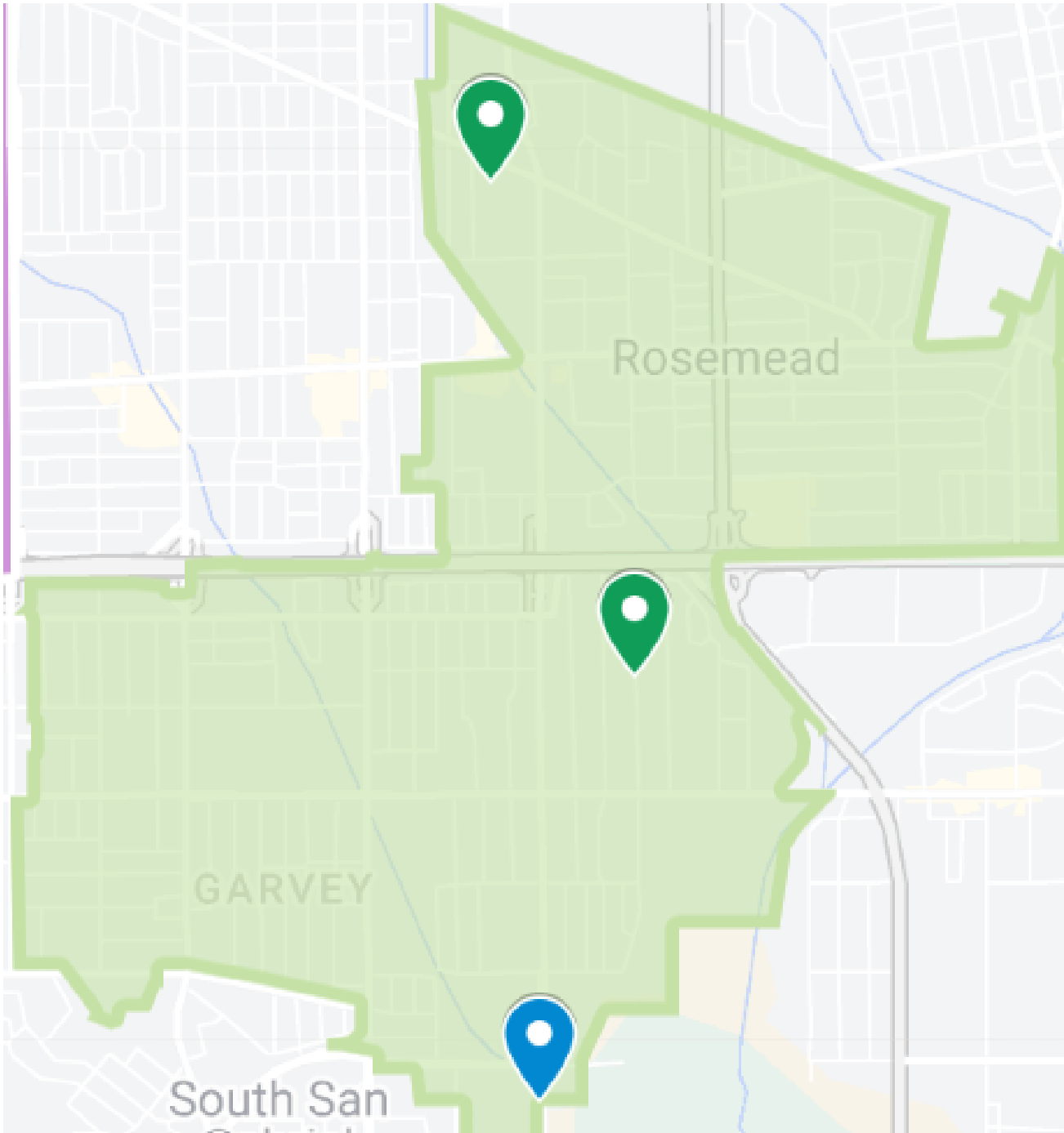
# REPORT TOTALS

<b>1</b> reports	<b>LEVEL 1</b> Coyote heard and/or seen; Coyote resting in public space
<b>2</b> reports	<b>LEVEL 2</b> Coyote seen resting in public area with humans present; Coyote entered yard or home with or without pets present
<b>0</b> reports	<b>LEVEL 3</b> Coyote entered yard and injured or killed unattended or attended pets; Coyote bit or injured an unattended pet/pet on a leash; Coyote aggressively followed or approached you with your pet
<b>0</b> reports	<b>LEVEL 4</b> Coyote aggressively followed or approached you without your pet
<b>0</b> reports	<b>LEVEL 5</b> Coyote bit or injured a human
