

### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Authorize the Executive Director to execute Change Order No. 33 with OHLA USA in the Not-to-Exceed (NTE) total amount of \$934,590 as full and final compensation for the Fairway Drive Grade Separation Project.

### **BACKGROUND**

In October 2014, the Alameda Corridor East Construction Authority (ACE)—now the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG)—awarded Construction Contract 14-01 to OHLA USA for the construction of the Fairway Drive Grade Separation Project. Substantial completion was achieved on August 29, 2023, with the opening of the new roadway section to the public.

### **CURRENT ISSUES**

Following substantial completion, project stakeholders—including Los Angeles County Public Works (LACPW), Caltrans, Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR), the City of Industry, and Majestic Realty—conducted inspections that generated additional punch list items. Completion of these items was required before stakeholders would assume maintenance responsibility for the project improvements. Additionally, the City of Industry requested several betterments related to street signage, road striping, and median features.

The additional work included upgrades to the stormwater pump station control systems, replacement of City of Industry street signs with LED-standard signage, and installation of added drainage improvements within the UPRR easements. Caltrans required traffic signals within its right-of-way to be upgraded to current standards, and LACPW requested installation of new door and lock hardware along with other anti-vandalism measures at the pump station.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

Project cost increases associated with these requirements will be funded through Measure M revenues. The City of Industry will fund its requested betterments.
