### **MONTH AT GLANCE**

During the month of April, the Neighborhood Coyote Program continued to document reports and share relevant information to residents who reported coyote activity in their neighborhoods.

Coyotes can become habituated as we allow them to be comfortable entering our yards and leaving readily available food sources. It is important to haze coyotes whenever you spot them entering the yards and driveways. Hazing tactics should not be used if a coyote is way out in the left field. Scaring off a coyote should be reserved for when a coyote has come close to you or your property. It is not recommended that you haze coyotes when they are simply walking in the street as they can also habutiate to "hazing" tactics.


