Rep. Sanchez Delivers \$2 Million Check for SGVCOG's Workforce Development Program



On February 15th, Congresswoman Linda Sanchez presented SGVCOG President Becky Shevlin, SGVCOG Third Vice President April Verlato and SGVCOG Executive Director Marisa Creter with a \$2 million check secured along with Congresswoman Grace Napolitano and U.S. Senator Alex Padilla as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. This new funding will be used to support SGV Works, the SGVCOG's Workforce Development Program, aimed at helping adults and at-risk youth from disadvantaged communities who are experiencing homelessness. Priority for funding will be given to residents of the SGVCOG's three tiny home shelter sites, including Operation Stay Safet in Montebello. This program will offer participants paid work experiences and supportive services, providing a pathway to employment and economic security.

After the check presentation, Congresswoman Sanchez toured the tiny home shelter with SGVCOG staff, Montebello Fire officials, and City staff. She offered brief remarks, commending the ongoing work being done at Operation Stay Safe while reaffirming her commitment to helping homeless individuals throughout the San Gabriel Valley.

Diamond Bar Golf Course Renovation Update



As part of the planned freeway improvements to the SR-57/SR-60 Confluence Project, the Diamond Bar Golf Course was temporarily closed on September 1, 2021. Since that date, the realignment of several holes has taken place. Renovations and improvements have been underway on the course and its support facilities, improving overall operations and golfing experience. The course is scheduled to reopen in late spring of this year.

Shaping, grading and irrigation replacement continues for fairways, tees, and greens.

- A new irrigation system throughout the course miles of pipe being set into the ground and new sprinkler heads put in place.
 Note: Fairways can take recycled water, but the greens require fresh water to protect them from elevated levels of salt in recycled water.
- Redesign includes efforts to cut back the amount of water needed to maintain the course, the reduction in water comes from reducing the amount of turf in fairway areas.

<u>Highlights of Golf Course Improvements</u>

- Redesign layouts of holes 3, 6 and 9
 - All 18 tee boxes and fairways are to be renovated
 - All 18 greens and sand traps are to be renovated



Course Closed to the Public

Please note that all golf course facilities remain closed during these renovations, with no public access to the course by motorized vehicles, bikes, or foot traffic. 
Alternative Golf Courses:

On February 3rd, members of the Water Policy Committee, Water Working Group, and neighboring water districts were treated to a tour of the Pomona Water Reclamation Plant, organized by the SGVCOG in partnership with the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts (LACSD) and Three Valleys Municipal Water District (TVMWD). The tour showcased the plant's cutting-edge primary, secondary, and tertiary water treatment processes while highlighting critical topics such as water supply, delivery, and future water needs for the region. The SGVCOG was honored to participate in the tour and is excited about the incredible work being done to ensure a sustainable water future for our community.

Fire Prep SGV's Claremont Wildfire Prevention Workshop


