BACKGROUND

At the inaugural meeting of the SB 79 Ad Hoc Committee, staff requested feedback from members on topics of interest for future committee meetings. Members expressed a desire for further information from the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) pertaining to specifics of SB 79 implementation, surfacing several questions over the course of the discussion. Staff synthesized this discussion into three key questions:

- Are sites containing rent-controlled units excluded from the universe of sites that must be considered when calculating total net zoned capacity for an alternative plan?
- For historic properties, are state and national historic properties included? Do properties designated as historic under a "cultural heritage ordinance" qualify as a historic property in the view of SB 79?
- How is the centerpoint of the SB 79 radius defined? What shape does the radius take -- circular, oblong, etc?

Once synthesized, these questions were sent to Townsend Public Affairs (TPA), who reached out to their contacts at HCD for further clarity. At the second meeting, members expressed the desire for direct conversations with HCD. Elisa Arcidiacono, representing TPA, invited representatives from HCD and the League of Cities to attend the June meeting to answer any lingering questions.

Elisa will also deliver a short presentation on information gleaned from conversations with HCD.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

BACKGROUND

In October of 2025, Governor Gavin Newsom signed SB 79 into law. SB 79 streamlined approval for housing developments within up to a half-mile distance from a major transit stop and directed each metropolitan planning organization (MPO) in California to develop and maintain an official SB 79 “Stops, Zones, and Tiers Map” for its region. The map provides a consistent, transparent regional dataset to help local jurisdictions, transit agencies, state partners, and other stakeholders understand where SB 79 applies.

The Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) is the MPO with authority over the San Gabriel Valley. On June 1, SCAG released their preliminary draft maps for SB 79. Prior to the map approach and methodology going before the SCAG Regional Council in early July, staff requested that the SGVCOG SB 79 Ad Hoc Committee receive an informational briefing.

Elisa Arcidiacono, representing Townsend Public Affairs, will present on the draft maps at the June meeting of the SGVCOG SB 79 Ad Hoc Committee.
