Comments are limited to a maximum of three minutes per person. The Committee Chair may impose additional time limits if comments become repetitious, an individual member of the public seeks to speak on numerous items, or a large number of members of the public seek to speak on an item. Except in limited situations, the Committee may not take action on items not appearing on the agenda and/or discuss them at length.

RE: **LA METRO OLYMPIC & PARALYMPIC GAMES PREPARATION**

RECOMMENDED ACTION

BACKGROUND

In 2017, the International Olympic Committee formally designated Los Angeles as the host of the 2028 Summer Olympic Games. Known as LA28, the vision of the Games celebrates the region's diversity and creativity, encourages partnerships among stakeholders, and promotes social inclusion, economic benefit, and environmental stewardship.

The Games are planned by an independent, non-profit, private entity, working in collaboration with both public and private organizations. LA28 is overseen by a volunteer board of directors and is funded through domestic sponsorships, licensing agreements, International Olympic Committee support, and other revenue streams.

The Olympic Games will be held from July 14-30, 2028 and the Paralympic Games will take place from August 15-27, 2028. Both events will be held at existing stadiums, arenas, and sports complexes throughout the Los Angeles region, and no new permanent construction or infrastructure is planned for LA28. To support travel to and from the Games, LA28 is collaborating with critical public transportation agencies in the region, including LA Metro, Caltrans, Metrolink, the Los Angeles Department of Transportation, and the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), to leverage public transit infrastructure and travel demand management plans.


Though no new permanent infrastructure is planned specifically for LA28, LA Metro has set separate priorities for a series of transportation infrastructure projects, with a completion target of 2028. These projects support LA28's sustainability goals and a "car-free games" vision established by LA Mayor Karen Bass. Anticipated projects, outlined in the 2022 Mobility Concept Plan, include bus-only lanes, county-wide mobility hubs, first/last mile plans, and other transportation improvement projects. LA Metro is also preparing for enhanced service and Games-specific routes that will improve mobility to venues.


In March 2024, the US Department of Transportation awarded LA Metro a \$139 million grant from the Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods (RCN) program for the "Removing Barriers and Creating Legacy-A Multimodal Approach for Los Angeles County" – a suite of projects identified in the Mobility Concept Plan. The funding will be invested in 35 miles of bus

priority enhancements, 60 Metro Bike Share stations, five first/last mile corridors that fill gaps in the active transportation network, five mobility hubs, and various supportive initiatives and operational strategies. A total of 12 jurisdictions (11 cities and 4 unincorporated communities of LA County) are involved in the RCN grant program: the cities of Bell, Bell Gardens, Carson, Downey, El Monte, Huntington Park, Industry, Long Beach, Los Angeles, Norwalk, and Santa Fe Springs; and unincorporated communities of Avocado Heights, Florence-Firestone, Rancho Dominguez, and Walnut Park.

SGVCOG is responsible for implementing a bus priority corridor through the cities of Industry, El Monte, and unincorporated LA County along Valley Boulevard. This project was envisioned in the SGV Transit Feasibility Study that was commissioned in 2021 by LA Metro and completed by SGVCOG last year. This corridor in particular was identified as a Jump Start project that could be completed using quick build treatments ahead of the 2028 Olympics. LA Metro completed the environmental clearance of the project in December 2024 and staff are now negotiating a funding agreement to enable SGVCOG to complete the design and construction phases. SGVCOG staff is also coordinating with Supervisor Hilda Solis’s Office and the LA County Department of Public Works to execute an additional funding agreement to supplement funds available under the RCN Grant. This additional funding will ensure that the project is delivered to its full extent and on time. SGVCOG staff and LA Metro staff are coordinating to identify further funds that can be used to advance other bus corridor projects envisioned in the SGV Transit Feasibility Study ahead of the Games.
