Members of the public are requested to state their name prior to speaking, and comments are limited to a maximum of three minutes per person. The Committee Chair may impose additional time limits if comments become repetitious, an individual member of the public seeks to speak on numerous items, or a large number of members of the public seek to speak on an item. The Committee may not take action on items not on the agenda and is restricted in discussing items on the agenda.

\*MEETING MODIFICATIONS DUE TO THE STATE AND LOCAL EMERGENCY RESULTING FROM THE THREAT OF COVID-19: AB 361 (Rivas), signed by California Governor Gavin Newsom on September 16, 2021, authorizes local agencies to hold public meetings via teleconferencing and allows for members of the public to observe and address the meeting telephonically or electronically to promote social distancing due to the state and local emergency resulting from the threat of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

To follow the new provisions in AB 361 and ensure the safety of Committee Members and staff for the purpose of limiting the risk of COVID-19, in-person public participation at the Capital Projects and Construction Committee meeting will not be allowed. # RECOMMENDED ACTION

Adopt Resolution 22-10-CPCC making certain findings that the existence of a local and state of emergency in California caused by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic continues to directly impact the ability of the SGVCOG to hold public meetings safely in person thereby necessitating an ability to continue holding meetings via teleconferencing.

# **BACKGROUND**

Introduced by Assembly member Robert Rivas (D-Hollister) on February 1, 2021, AB 361 codifies portions of Governor Gavin Newsom's existing Ralph M. Brown Act exemptions pertaining to teleconferencing if a local agency issues an emergency finding, and reissues it every 30 days, that it is unsafe to meet in person. Specifically, the Brown Act exemptions include requirements to provide a public teleconference location, to maintain a member quorum within the agency's jurisdiction and to provide for public comment at each teleconference location, such as a private residence. The legislation expires in December 2024. On September 16, 2021, California Governor Gavin Newsom signed AB 361 into law, effective immediately.

A local agency wishing to rely on the provisions of AB 361 must meet one of the following criteria:

- 1. The local agency holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency, and state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; or
- 2. The local holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or
- 3. The local agency holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and has determined, by majority vote, that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

On March 4, 2020, Governor Newsom proclaimed a State of Emergency in California due to the threat of COVID-19 and shortly thereafter issued Executive Order N-29-20 suspending certain Brown Act provisions relating to teleconferencing as public meetings began to be held online. However, this Executive Order expired on September 30, 2021, despite the State of Emergency remaining in place.

The threat that COVID-19 has presented continues to directly impact the ability of the SGVCOG to conduct Governing Board/committee meetings safely in person. Updated guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Los Angeles Department of Public Health in July and August 2021 advise governmental entities to refrain from conducting indoor meetings and consider moving operations outdoors, where feasible, to prevent transmission. SGVCOG staff has been unable to find a suitable outdoor space with the requisite audio/visual capabilities at which the monthly Capital Projects and Construction Committee meetings can be held safely. Similarly, an indoor space with sufficient capacity to accommodate safe social distance practices among members, staff, and the public could not be identified.

In order to continue to conduct meetings in a safe manner and to prevent unnecessary COVID-19 exposure to members, staff and the public, staff is recommending that the Capital Projects and Construction Committee adopt Resolution 22-10-CPCC making certain findings in order to be able to continue teleconferencing for its meetings.



# **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Authorize the Executive Director to issue Task Order No. 4 Revision 23, not to exceed ("NTE") \$331,500.00, to Moffatt & Nichol ("M&N") to continue services under Revision 21, to provide utility manager services on an interim basis, and to prepare the Invitation for Bids (IFB) construction package for the Montebello Boulevard Grade Separation Project ("Montebello Project").

## **BACKGROUND**

The Montebello Project is a project within the Alameda Corridor-East ("ACE") program of projects. The overall project will improve four of the five current at-grade rail crossings within the city of Montebello, including a grade separation on Montebello Boulevard, and at-grade safety improvements at Vail Avenue, Maple Avenue, and Greenwood Avenue.

The Montebello Project is programmed to receive \$49 million in State SB1 Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP) funds and \$18.851 million from the Proposition 1B Trade Corridor Improvement Fund (TCIF). In December 2020, the California Transportation Commission (CTC) approved an extension of the period of project allocation under Waiver 20-95 to August 31, 2022 for the programmed amount of \$49 million and granted another amendment to extend the project allocation time from August 31, 2022 to December 31, 2022. On October 5, 2022, SGVCOG submitted a request to the CTC for approval of the \$49 million SB1 TCEP allocation at their December 2022 meeting. The Prop 1B TCIF allocation of \$18.851 million was programmed to the Montebello Project in March 2020 and was also included in the request to the CTC for approval at their December 2022 meeting.

#### **CURRENT ISSUES**

The recommended amendment comprises three specific tasks (see detailed explanations and assumptions in Attachment 2: Scope of Work):

- Program management and funding certification (as needed through the end of February 2023): \$237,240.00
- Staff augmentation and technical support (as needed through the end of February 2023): \$20,120.00
- Interim utility manager services: \$43,280.00

• Completion of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) construction bid package: \$30,600.00

• Other direct costs: \$260.00

# **FISCAL IMPACT**

The recommended Task Order revision is a necessary and prudent allocation of resources. The salary savings due to the vacant position will help offset some of the added costs. With the funding allocation by the CTC in December 2022 and the anticipated release of construction procurement in early 2023, staff will closely contain the overall project cost with greater certainty. We expect to complete a funding arrangement with Metro for the Montebello Corridor Project prior to entering into construction in mid-2023.

Authorize the Executive Director to issue Task Order No. 3 Revision 13, not to exceed ("NTE") \$466,982, to Moffatt & Nichol ("M&N") to prepare the final plans, specifications, and estimates for the at-grade safety improvements at Maple Avenue, to prepare and finalize the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) GO-88-B form for each of the three at-grade safety improvement projects, and to provide counts related to vehicular, pedestrian, and other construction items for the Montebello Boulevard Grade Separation Project ("Montebello Project").

# **BACKGROUND**

The Montebello Project is a project within the Alameda Corridor-East ("ACE") program of projects. The overall project will improve four of the five current at-grade rail crossings within the city of Montebello, including a grade separation on Montebello Boulevard, and at-grade safety improvements at Vail Avenue, Maple Avenue, and Greenwood Avenue.

The Montebello Project is programmed to receive \$49 million in State SB1 Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP) funds and \$18.851 million from the Proposition 1B Trade Corridor Improvement Fund (TCIF). In December 2020, the California Transportation Commission (CTC) approved an extension of the period of project allocation under Waiver 20-95 to August 31, 2022 for the programmed amount of \$49 million and granted another amendment to extend the project allocation time from August 31, 2022 to December 31, 2022. On October 5, 2022, SGVCOG submitted a request to the CTC for approval of the \$49 million SB1 TCEP allocation at their December 2022 meeting. The Prop 1B TCIF allocation of \$18.851 million was programmed to the Montebello Project in March 2020 and was also included in the request to the CTC for approval at their December 2022 meeting.

# **CURRENT ISSUES**

The recommended amendment comprises three specific tasks (see detailed explanations and assumptions in Attachment 2: Scope of Work):

- Prepare final plans, specifications, and estimates for the at-grade safety improvement project at Maple Avenue: \$412,300.00
- Prepare and finalize CPUC GO-88-B forms for Vail Avenue, Maple Avenue, and Greenwood Avenue, and provide vehicular and pedestrian counts: \$46,990.00

• Provide construction item estimates for the Caltrans ePPR: \$7,500.00

• Other direct costs: \$192.00

# FISCAL IMPACT

The recommended Task Order revision is a necessary and prudent allocation of resources. The salary savings due to the vacant position will help offset some of the added costs. With the funding allocation by the CTC in December 2022 and the anticipated release of construction procurement in early 2023, staff will closely contain the overall project cost with greater certainty. We expect to complete a funding arrangement with Metro for the Montebello Corridor Project prior to entering into construction in mid-2023.

RAILROAD SAFETY SERVICES, INC. FOR RAILROAD FLAGGING SERVICES FOR FAIRWAY DRIVE GRADE SEPARATION PROJECT

# **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Authorize the Executive Director to execute Amendment No. 2 to Agreement 22-10 in an amount of \$50,000 to National Railroad Safety Services ("NRSS") to continue to provide railroad flagging services for the Fairway Drive Grade Separation Construction Project ("Fairway Project").

# **BACKGROUND**

In December of 2001, the Alameda Corridor – East Construction Authority ("ACE"), now the San Gabriel Valley Council of Government ("SGVCOG") entered into a Master Agreement for Construction, Operation and Maintenance of Highway – Railroad Underpasses ("Master Agreement") with Union Pacific Railroad Company ("UPRR"). The Master Agreement created the framework for which UPRR and ACE would cooperate in support of the various grade separation projects. In addition to the Master Agreement, on April 25, 2014, ACE entered into a four party Construction, Operation and Maintenance Agreement ("COM Agreement") with Union Pacific Railroad Company ("UPRR"), the County of Los Angeles and the City of Industry. The COM Agreement defined the responsibilities of each of the parties during construction and after the project is complete specifically for the Fairway Project. Both agreements indicate that UPRR shall provide flagging services using UPRR personnel or an approved third party flagging service. The Master Agreement and COM stipulates that UPRR shall be reimbursed for said services.

#### **CURRENT ISSUES**

For the Fairway Project, after initially providing flagging services utilizing UPRR forces, UPRR notified the Agency that they would no longer be able to provide flagging services using UPRR forces after February 11, 2022 and would require the Agency to utilize the services of an approved third party provide the flagging services under direct contract to SGVCOG.

Because there are only two third party flagging service vendors (Railpros, Inc. and NRSS) approved by UPRR, a formal procurement was not conducted. Both vendors were contacted by phone or E mail to request quotes. The two quotes received were evaluated by staff. The rates provided by NRSS were the lower of the two quotes provided. A contract in the amount of \$243,200 was issued to NRSS under the Executive Director's authority effective February 9,2022. On August 22, 2022 the CPCC approved Amendment No.1 to the NRSS Agreement increasing the authorization \$91,665 which established the new NTE amount of \$334,865. Due to various project delays including unforeseen conditions affecting sewer line and pile driving work and

various utility related delays, it is now necessary to increase the amount authorized to allow NRSS to continue to provide flagging services to the end of the project as necessary. These services are to be provided on an as needed daily or hourly basis. In order to determine the NTE amount, the rate was multiplied by the projected number of flagging days/hours that are estimated to be required on the Fairway Project. Amendment No. 2 will also extend the term of the contract from December 31, 2022 to March 31, 2023.

Staff is recommending approval and execution of Amendment No.2 to Agreement 22-10 with NRSS to provide the flagging services for the Fairway Project. The Amendment will increase the agreement amount by \$50,000 for a total NTE amount of \$384,865.

In addition to the authorization of the NTE amount of \$ 384,865, an additional 10% contingency allowance, or \$ 38,486 will be budgeted for the Executive Director, to address unforeseen work or owner-initiated changes, in accordance with normal agency procedures. Any necessary contract amount changes exceeding the Executive Director's authority will be brought back to the Committee for further consideration and approval.

# **FISCAL IMPACT**

This agreement will have no impact to the overall project budget at this time. Flagging services were already included in the budget as a UPRR reimbursable cost. It is estimated that existing budgeted contingency funds are available to fund this increase.

# **BACKGROUND**

Each month committee members receives an update on key programs. Committee members may contact staff for clarifications on any of the reported items prior to the scheduled meeting. The following are items of note since the last meeting:

# I. PROJECTS

# **Diamond Bar Golf Course Project – Explanation on the First Change Order**

Construction continues on the Diamond Bar Golf Course. Contractor recently completed installing the new netting poles, reaching as high as 170 feet into the air. The demolition of concrete cart paths, a maintenance building, and drainage culverts had left a large pile of debris. The contractor will use a rock crusher to recycle the material which will be used as the base for new cart paths, access roads, and construction of new maintenance building. The new maintenance building is taking shape and foundation and utility work is near completion. Rough shaping and rough grading operations are near completion on the west side.

# Fairway Drive Grade Separation Project

Phase 3 bridge structural steel, including welding and painting was completed in September. Construction of Phase 3 abutment footings and walls was completed in October. Work on retaining walls and the pump station will continue through October. Walnut Valley Water District commenced installation of their main line on Fairway in October and SCE is also scheduled to begin installation of electrical in late October. The project team is working towards the opening of Fairway Drive in the late January/early February 2023 timeframe with overall project completion scheduled for March of 2023.

# **Montebello Corridor Project**

On October 7<sup>th</sup>, SGVCOG staff submitted to the California Transportation Commission (CTC) the project allocation request for \$49,000,000 from Senate Bill 1 (SB1) Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP) and \$18,851,000 from Proposition 1B (Prop 1B) Trade Corridor Improvement Fund (TCIF) for the Montebello Boulevard Grade Separation Project at its December 7<sup>th</sup> meeting. The Construction, Operations, and Maintenance (COM) Agreement was fully executed with UPRR and the City of Montebello. We anticipate issuing the construction contract by June 2023.

# **Fullerton Road Grade Separation Project**

The Fullerton Road Grade Separation Project continues to make progress towards opening the new and improved intersection south of the tracks by Thanksgiving 2022. Roadway concrete pavement was substantially completed in September and grinding, sealing and other pavement related work is underway. Asphalt pavement, striping, signage and signals is scheduled to be completed in October. Retaining wall, underground utility, private property restoration and work within the UPRR ROW also continues, subject to UPRR approvals. The project team continues to seek the necessary approvals from UPRR to perform work within the UPRR ROW and to look for opportunities to mitigate the delays associated with obtaining the required approvals.

# La Verne Gold Line Pedestrian Bridge

The design consultant, KPFF prepared and submitted the draft GO-88B application to the California Utilities Public Commission (CPUC). KPFF is working on the comments by CPUC and completing the 70% design plans. NEPA documentation is underway in support of the recently granted federal earmark.

# **Turnbull Canyon Grade Separation Project**

Appraisals and package offers for the required acquisition of private right of way have been completed for this project. The Resolution of Necessity for property acquisitions will be presented for adoption at the December Governing Board meeting.

#### II. FUNDING

In August, the California Transportation Commission (CTC) approved a four-month extension for the funding allocation of \$49 million from the Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP) and \$18.8 million from the Proposition 1B (Prop 1B) Trade Corridor Improvement Fund (TCIF) funds previously programmed to the Montebello Boulevard Grade Separation Project. SGVCOG staff has submitted the funding allocation request and all required documentation, including the fully executed Construction, Operations and Maintenance (COM) Agreement, for CTC approval at its December 7-8, 2022 meeting.
