# Celebrate Community Mobility at Active Streets 2024 Mission-to-Mission!



We're thrilled to announce the return of the Mission-to-Mission Open Streets Event **on Sunday**, **April 28th**, **2024**. In partnership with LA Metro and ActiveSGV, we are converting the streets of Alhambra, San Gabriel, and South Pasadena into an exciting space free from car traffic, perfect for walking, biking, and exploring. This popular regional event will allow pedestrians and cyclists to enjoy 5 miles of roadway free of charge. Each city will have a hub showcasing local businesses, organizations, and entertainment. The day will begin with an Opening Ceremony at 8:15 am at the South Pasadena Hub, located by City Hall. We can't wait to see you at this special community celebration. ## Promoting San Gabriel Valley's Interests in Washington, D.C.



During the second week of March, SGVCOG President Tim Hepburn led a delegation to Washington, D.C., to advocate for the San Gabriel Valley's needs directly to federal lawmakers and agencies. The team included Ricky Choi, Director of Government and Community Relations, Steph Wong, Senior Management Analyst, and specialists from Townsend Public Affairs. They aimed to discuss funding requirements and priorities for crucial areas such as housing, homelessness, transportation and infrastructure, and environmental sustainability.









During their time in D.C., the SGVCOG team met with members of the U.S. Congress and officials from various federal agencies that oversee funding crucial to the San Gabriel Valley's projects and initiatives. These meetings were an opportunity to highlight the agency's achievements and advocate for continued and enhanced federal support.

The trip was a vital step in strengthening the SGVCOG's relationship with federal decision-makers, ensuring they are aware of and support the San Gabriel Valley's priorities. The delegation's efforts are expected to bolster support for the region, contributing to the continued success of SGVCOG's initiatives.

SR 57/60 Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project Community Open House & Project Update



On March 18th, the SGVCOG hosted a Community Open House in Diamond Bar to raise community awareness of the progress of the SR 57/60 Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project. The meeting was attended by Mayor Stan Liu, Mayor Pro Tem Chia Yu Teng, and Councilmembers Andrew Chou and Ruth Low, along with more than 30 residents, underscoring the community's vested interest in the enhancements being made to our highways. Ricky Choi, our Director of Government and Community Relations, initiated the discussion with an overview of the project's objectives and anticipated outcomes. This was further elaborated by Rene Coronel, P.E., Senior Project Manager, who answered questions and delved into the specifics of the construction process, providing attendees with a comprehensive understanding of the project's scope and its critical role in alleviating traffic congestion.





The feedback provided by residents was invaluable, and the SGVCOG is grateful for the City of Diamond Bar's leadership and partnership in addressing this critical infrastructure project. # Coyotes Among Us: Spreading Awareness Through Community Engagement



This March, the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments' Neighborhood Coyote Program embarked on an educational journey, making stops in the cities of San Marino, Rosemead and Arcadia to raise awareness about living safely with coyotes. Our first destination was a fun-filled day at San Marino's Lunar New Year Festival on Sunday, March 10th, distributing educational materials and engaging with over 100 residents. Then, we were at Rosemead's festive St.

"PAW"tricks Day event on Saturday, March 16th. Amidst the festive St. Patrick's Day atmosphere, our team connected with families, distributing informational pamphlets, whistles, and coloring books for kids. Conversations revolved around pet safety in coyote-prone areas, the importance of reporting unusual coyote behavior, and the importance of engaging the community in proactive coexistence practices.



Next, the road then took us to Hugo Reid Elementary School in Arcadia on Thursday, March 21st. Here, we presented to over 61 students. Our presentation aimed to demystify these often misunderstood creatures, focusing on their origins, natural behaviors, and how to share our spaces with them safely. Each student left with a new understanding of coyotes, armed with coloring books and whistles to remind them of the day's lessons.





### Connect SGV Podcast Episode: SGV Works





## Defend Your Home Against Wildfires: Join Our Wildfire Preparedness Webinar




