In the month of April, we continued to experience the effects of COVID-19 nationally and locally. The Neighborhood Coyote Program continues to document reports and share necessary information to those who have reported coyote activity in their neighborhoods. Wednesday, April 22nd we shared the Pasadena Humane Society & SPCA's Coyote Safety Live Webinar. The webinar was very informative and included 228 live attendees and 384 total registrants. All registrants were sent a link to the recorded webinar after the webinar ended. We have continued to work with external stakeholders to ensure information is uniformed when delivered to your community members. We look forward to our upcoming coyote informational webinar in the month of May.

Within the City of Temple City, there was **1** report of coyote interactions for the month of April. The Neighborhood Coyote Program responded to the report. The Program made contact with the reporter by phone. The report was classified as **Response Level 1**. Response Level 1 includes the hearing or sighting of coyotes or a coyotes resting in public space. No hazing techniques were used. The report was made to the UCANR Coyote Cacher online form. There was a total of **1** coyote seen in the City of of Temple City in the month of April.


