Members of the public wishing to speak are asked to complete a comment card or simply rise to be recognized when the Chair asks for public comments to speak. We ask that members of the public state their name for the record and keep their remarks brief. If several persons wish to address the Committee on a single item, the Chair may impose a time limit on individual remarks at the beginning of discussion. The Water Committee and Water TAC may not discuss or vote on items not on the agenda.

RE: WEBSITE DEVELOPMENT BEST PRACTICES FOR MS4 PERMIT COMPLIANCE

BACKGROUND

In December 2019, the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board) released the Working Proposal of the Regional Phase 1 Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit and in August 2020, released the Tentative Permit. For both the Working Proposal and the Tentative Permit, the Water Policy Committee and TAC developed comment letters that were submitted to the Regional Board.

On June 4, 2021, the Regional Board released the Revised Tentative Permit and a notice of public hearings for the issuance of the Permit, which took place on July 8, 9, 16, and 23. The Permit and an overview of all comments received can be found <u>here</u>.

On August 9, 2021, the Regional Board released the final Permit. The memo from the Regional Board with instructions on how to access the Permit is in Attachment A.

DISCUSSION

As a part of complying with the new MS4 Permit, watershed management groups must incorporate a certain degree of public transparency, including developing a website, hosting public meetings, among other things. The Upper Los Angeles River Watershed Management Group (ULAR WMG) is currently the only watershed management group in the region with a dedicated website for its MS4 compliance, which can be viewed by <u>clicking here</u>. The website currently includes updates on regional stormwater projects, information on pollutants, and interactive videos that provide background information on ULAR WMG, Measure W, and the watershed management group's mission and purpose.

At this meeting, Dawn Petschauer, Senior Water Biologist at LA Sanitation & Environment, of will present to the Water Technical Advisory Committee on lessons learned while building the ULAR WMG website, essential vs. nonessential content to include, and additions they will be making to the ULAR WMG website based on the new MS4 Permit requirements.
