Villa Esperanza: A Milestone of Hope in the Heart of Pomona



On September 14th, Becky Shevlin, the Vice Chair of the San Gabriel Valley Regional Housing Trust (SGVRHT) and Mayor of Monrovia, provided remarks at the grand opening of Villa Esperanza in Pomona. This joint venture of the SGVRHT, Jamboree Housing, and the City of Pomona transformed a onceempty lot into a state-of-the-art affordable housing complex.

This project holds a special place in the timeline of the SGVRHT. It's the first affordable housing endeavor funded by the Trust that has completed construction and opened its doors for occupancy. The Trust contributed \$1,350,000 to the project, with half of this funding coming from the state's Local Housing Trust Fund program.



Villa Esperanza embodies the shared vision of its creators, showcasing impressive architectural design that meets LEED Silver certification standards and promotes sustainable living. The community offers various services and opportunities to aid residents' personal development. The services provided include ESL classes, job training, and vital healthcare services, which significantly impact the residents' well-being.



Villa Esperanza is located on the busy West Mission Boulevard, providing its residents with a prime location. With easy access to public transportation and the lively Pomona Farmer's Market, essential amenities are just a stone's throw away. This makes everyday living enjoyable and convenient for the residents.

SGVCOG Leads Comprehensive Internet
Connectivity Study



The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) is on a mission to improve high-speed internet access for every resident and organization within the San Gabriel Valley (SGV). To this end, SGVCOG is spearheading a study to examine internet availability across various locales within the region. This venture is instrumental in delineating broadband needs and discovering viable pathways for enhancing connectivity. Our initiative is straightforward yet revolutionary— providing households and organizations with expedited, more dependable internet connections.

In a collaborative endeavor with Magellan Advisors, SGVCOG is producing a sequence of webinars to accrue insights regarding connectivity requisites and prospects from a diverse array of stakeholders across the San Gabriel Valley. We invite you to participate in multiple focus group discussions; however, we request your attendance only in those sessions that align with your expertise.

Registration is open for the Regional Broadband Planning Needs Assessment focus group sessions slated for November. SGVCOG, in collaboration with Magellan, is extending its outreach to community, public, non-profit, and private sector stakeholders. This collective effort aims to collate invaluable insights, which will inform the needs assessment and significantly influence the formulation of the Regional Broadband Strategic Plan.

Each focus group is relevant to a unique set of backgrounds, and you are encouraged to join multiple sessions. Meetings will be held via Microsoft Teams. You can register here for the following sessions: City Administration and Municipal Operations, Education and Workforce, Emergency Preparedness, First Responders and Public Safety, Entrepreneurship and Small Business, Health, Recreation, Social Support and Wellness, Housing, Real Estate, and Residential Development, Major Business and Targeted Industries, Transit and Transportation, Utilities, Natural Resources, and Environment.

SGVCOG has already completed 16 railroad-grade separation projects as part of the Alameda Corridor-East (ACE) Project, enhancing goods movement and pedestrian safety in the region. The panel, organized by the Construction Network, fostered a vital discussion on improving railroad systems, bringing together various experts in the field. The collaborative effort highlighted at this event paves the way for a promising outlook on the region's railroad infrastructure, ensuring a structured approach towards safety and efficiency.

SGVCOG Be Well OC Campus Tours Foster Dialogue to Strengthen Mental Health Services in the San Gabriel Valley



On September 18th, San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) staff engaged in three sequential tours at the Be Well OC campus in the City of Orange. Guided by Dr. Kathryn Hamel, the tours showcased a wide array of mental health services available on campus, leaving attendees with a newfound appreciation for their practical approach to mental health.

The tours fostered engaging discussions among various stakeholders from agencies, including Arcadia, Baldwin Park, Duarte, Glendora, La Verne, LA County Department of Mental Health, Monrovia, and the offices of State Senator Susan Rubio and Supervisor Hilda Solis, alongside West Covina

representatives. The interaction aimed at understanding the services Orange County's pioneering facility provided.

With every tour filled to capacity, the turnout underscored a significant interest in learning and sharing ideas on enhancing mental health services. Be Well OC, which launched three wellness campuses in Orange County in 2021, also operates mobile mental health crisis units throughout the county. Their comprehensive mental health system encompasses substance use services and covers a wide range of needs, from prevention and early intervention to crisis aversion, acute care, and recovery.

SGVCOG thanks Be Well OC and Dr. Kathryn Hamel for hosting and all attendees for contributing to meaningful discussions. The tour provided an indepth understanding of the available mental health services in Orange County and spurred dialogue on collaborative strategies to bolster mental health and wellness in the San Gabriel Valley.
